for World Heritage Site status!

1 Nintoku-tenno-ryo kofun (Tomb of Emperor Nintoku)

Japan's largest keyhole-shaped burial mound, this is 486m in length (840m long including the moat). It is one of the three largest tombs in the world, along with the Pyramid of Khufu in Egypt and the Mausoleum of the First Qin Emperor in China. The mound has a triple moat, and there are more than 10 other small and medium size tombs in the surrounding area. Efforts are now underway to have the entire Mozu Kofungun Ancient Tumulus Cluster registered as a World Heritage Site as a means of preserving it for the future.



2 Bicycle Museum Cycle Center

A museum and exhibition charting the history of bicycles and promoting Sakai as a hub of bicycle industry and culture. Try your hand at riding replicas of classic bikes in "Bicycle Square" on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of every month and on public holidays. Free riding lessons are also available (reservations required).

3 Sakai City Tea Houses: Shin-an and Obai-an

"Obai-an" is a tearoom said to have been built by Imai Sokyu, one of the great tea masters of Japan. "Shin-an" was designed by Ogi Rodo, one of the great exponents of the Sukiya style of architecture in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Shin-an has chairs so you can enjoy a more informal style of tea ceremony.

4 Sakai City Museum

A fascinating introduction to Sakai's history and culture from prehistoric times to the present day. You can also enjoy a VR video experience featuring a stunning 360° aerial panorama of Mozu Kofungun (admission fee payable).

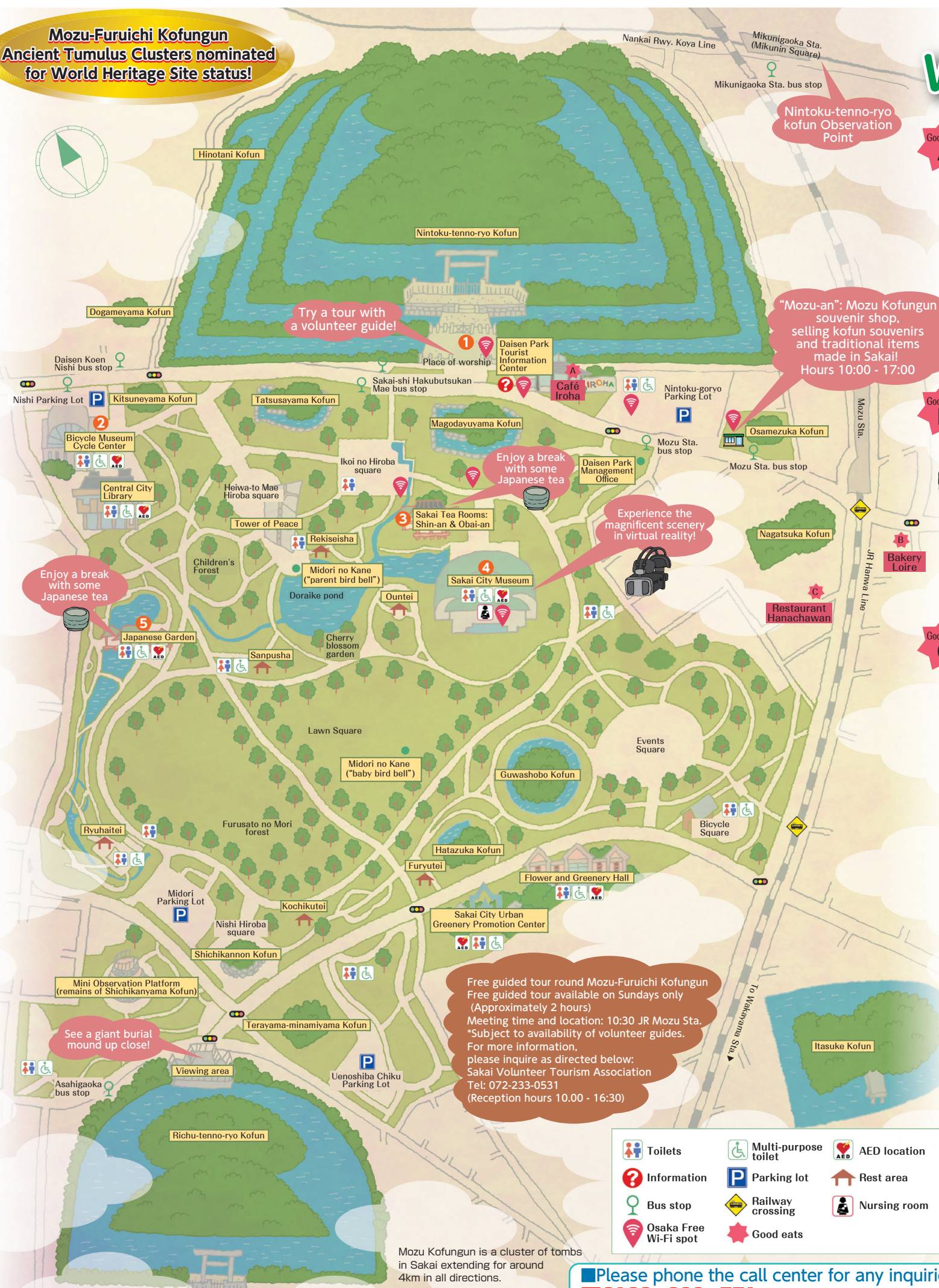

A traditional Japanese garden showcasing landscaping features and techniques. Passing through the cypress gate, you see a beautiful lake and stream, elegant buildings, and a variety of seasonal plants and flowers. You can also enjoy a serving of Japanese tea.

A Good eats Goryo Sandwich

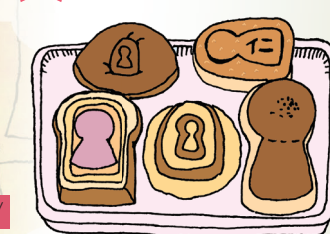


Café Iroha

B Good eats Goryo bread

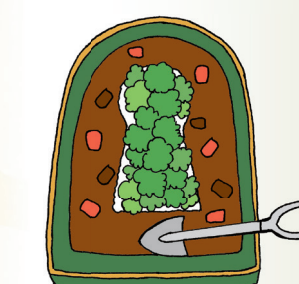


Bakery Loire
